



## PINE CONE ORNAMENT

### Supplies Needed:

1/6 of a yard of fabric 45" wide

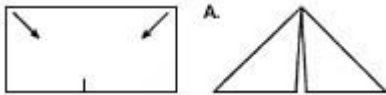
3" Dylite egg

125 sequins pins  $\frac{1}{2}$ " or size 8

1 yard of  $\frac{3}{8}$ " satin ribbon for bow

12" of  $\frac{1}{8}$ " ribbon, to hang ornament

Cut 3 two-inch strips of fabric (45" length) and iron each in half lengthwise. Cut these strips into 2" lengths, then fold ends to make triangles (fold the top right corner down to the bottom middle and fold the top left corner down to the bottom middle). Press each triangle to make a crisp point. The raw edges will be along the top long side of the triangle. Make 55-60 of these triangles. You'll also need two 2" x 2" pieces not folded, for each end of the egg. Note: If you do not have 45" lengths of fabric available, but have a piece or pieces big enough to cut sixty 2" squares from, you may do that and make the triangles from these.



Pin the unfolded squares to the top and bottom of the egg, with a pin in each corner. Then starting at the bottom (smaller) end of the egg-shape, pin the first two triangles onto the egg, with one pin in each of two corners, (arrange so that half of the triangles are off the egg to create a sharp point). There will be four triangles in the second row and then eight in the next. Pin the rest of the triangles overlapping each by about  $\frac{1}{2}$ " over the one before. Progress up the egg in overlapping rows, slightly off-center from the row before (so the point of the triangle will overlap between two triangles in the row before). Continue this until you have covered the entire egg. You will use between 50 and 60 triangles per egg depending on how you arrange them. Individuals vary slightly in technique.



Loosely loop  $\frac{3}{8}$ " ribbon back and forth to create a bow, loosely tie by bringing the end piece from underneath up and over the bow and back through. Slip the  $\frac{1}{8}$ " ribbon through before tying the  $\frac{3}{8}$ " ribbon in a bow. Tie a knot in the  $\frac{1}{8}$ " ribbon and slip it under the  $\frac{3}{8}$ " ribbon on top of the bow. Pin or use glue gun to attach bow to egg.
